

MiDA is on Track



CEO, COO, and Community Services Manager signs MiDAs part of the Contract

On Friday the 29th of May, 2009, the Millennium Development Authority signed contracts with Three (3) Consultancy Firms who possess expertise in three areas of School Facility Construction, Water Sanitation and Rural Electrification to begin work in the Southern Intervention Zone of MiDA.

The Chief Operating Officer, Mr. Matthew Armah told the Consultants that their 'Jobs are done when contracts are awarded for the building of

Schools and Water projects in the South.

The Community Service Development Programme of MiDA will construct School Facilities, Water and Sanitation Projects. The Water and Sanitation Projects include the extension of pipes to communities, bore holes and small town water systems.

The type of contract signed is called Indefinite Supply Indefinite Quantity. This in essence means that if MiDA is satisfied with their output then they can be eligible for other Contracts in the Future without necessary undergoing the strenuous procurement process that MiDA took them through. The COO said "the process is to bring out the best batch of people to get the job done." He later warned that "the middle name of the project is challenge, they should find solutions" and not chronologize challenges for discourse. Identify the problem and tell MiDA how it was solved"

The CEO Martin Eson Benjamin said those who do not perform will not get another chance.

In the southern zone, there will be a total of 86 school facilities built and 51 communities will benefit from the water project.
