



SUMMARY OF THE 17TH SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MILLENNIUM DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

NOVEMBER 30, 2017

Minutes of the 17th Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Millennium Development Authority ("MiDA") held at the Fiesta Residences, Accra on the abovementioned date and time and for which Notice was duly given in writing on November 28, 2017.

The meeting was convened pursuant to (i) the Millennium Challenge Compact between the United States of America, acting through the Millennium Challenge Corporation ("MCC"), and the Government of the Republic of Ghana (the "Government"), executed on August 5, 2014 (the "Compact"); and (ii) the Program Implementation Agreement, by and between the United States of America, acting through MCC, and the Republic of Ghana, dated August 5, 2014 (the "PIA"). 3. DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS

i. MiDA Performance

The Board recalled that there had been a number of delays with the implementation of the Compact. To date, Compact implementation was slow and this was a result of a combination of a number of issues. Some of the issues were internal to MiDA and others were external. The Board considered the challenges with Compact implementation and took a number of decisions to address the challenges.
